What We Do

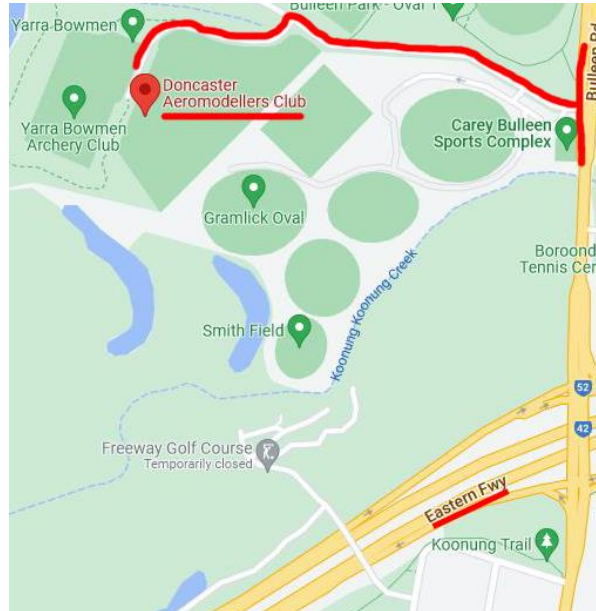

How To Join DAC

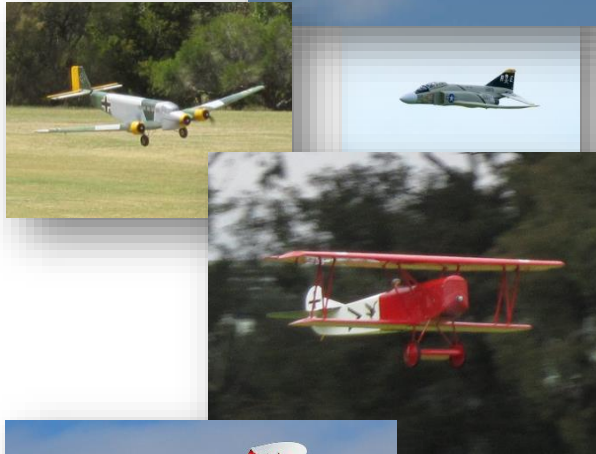


- You need to visit us at least 3 times and fly with an Instructor using our gear, if you have none. Try before you join. This gives you the opportunity to check us out and ask all the important questions, plus see how we operate.
- Basic RC training to solo level is done mainly Saturday afternoon, and to get the most out of your training you should attend every Saturday. Control Line training is done mainly on Sunday afternoons.
- Initial fees for new members are \$324 (Senior) which includes DAC joining fee and annual subscription, VMAA and MAAA annual subscription and MAAA insurance.
- Start-up cost for RC beginner ~\$1200 (Juniors ~\$1000), which includes fees and all your gear which you need to buy elsewhere. **Do NOT buy anything** until you get advice from DAC flying instructor. There is no cost for training.
- After your 3rd visit you will need to seek a DAC authorised trainer to sign your membership application form. Once signed, your application form will be reviewed by the committee and, subject to approval (allow a couple weeks), you can then make payment. Once payment received you will get a DAC starter kit with welcome letter, club rules, etc.
- Juniors (under age 18, lower fees apply) are welcome to join, but we strongly encourage a parent to attend and, better still, make it a family activity and share the experience and cost.
- Once a member of DAC, training will commence for you to obtain your Bronze(P)/Silver(P) wings which is required to fly solo at DAC.
- Solo weekdays flying is limited to approved members who have established a very good track record of aircraft maintenance, control and safety.
- DAC is a RC plane club firstly and therefore you need to obtain your plane wings before you are allowed to do RC Heli/Multirotor training.
